The minutes of the January 04, 2007 meeting were approved.

The dean reinforced the importance of the upcoming NCA meetings with faculty, scheduled for Feb. 12 and Feb. 13, and encouraged those who are able to attend to do so.

Paul Clemens spoke of the changes to the latest draft of the College Bylaws, changes based on previous Faculty Council discussions. There was yet more discussion, mainly of the constitution of the College Merit Committee—whether it should be elected, as the draft of the bylaws stated, or consist of one member from each department. A motion to accept this draft of the bylaws, with minor emendations and with an elected salary committee in place, passed council vote.

Don Spinelli presented a proposal for a new MA program in Peace Studies, jointly offered with the University of Windsor and administered through the Department of Interdisciplinary Studies. There were many questions about the program, and the council felt it was a good idea to invite Fred Pearson, director of Peace and Conflict Studies, to the March 1 meeting of council to explain the program in greater detail and address any questions and concerns.
