Under the 2005 Wayne-Windsor Exchange Agreement, undergraduate students may take a maximum of three UW courses, and graduate students may take a maximum of two UW courses over the duration of their entire degree program. Students will register in a directed study course and pay tuition and fees to Wayne State University.

Any course taken at University of Windsor must be one that is **NEVER** offered at Wayne State University. No exceptions to this rule will be granted.
